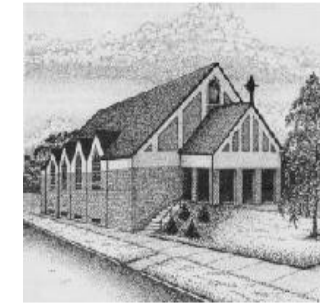

### PRAYER OF CONFESSION
